If you have any shortage or facing difficulties in understanding any description please contact Panditji. Ensure that the Pooja begins in time so that it can be completed in time before lunch or dinner as scheduled. Ensure that you have some relatives/friends to help you on the Ganesh Pratishthapana day right from the beginning till end.
